- 1. What is your personality?**
 - Do you prefer working in groups or alone?
 - Do you enjoy helping others or competing with others?
 - Are you a thinker or a doer?
 - Do you enjoy more creative activities or structured activities?

- 2. What are your interests?**
 - What hobbies do I like?
 - Do I enjoy working inside or outside?
 - Do I like working with people, data, books or animals?
 - What are my favourite activities?

- 3. What education or training do you need?**
 - Think about your chosen career and look at examples using job sites like Indeed to focus on the requirements needed for the role.

- 4. What are your skills?**
 - What skills have you gained through school? (like maths, art or writing)?
 - What life skills do you have? For example, teamwork or time management...

- 5. What is the salary for your chosen career?**
 - Think about the lifestyle you want. Does the yearly salary meet your chosen lifestyle?

- 6. Where do you want to live?**
 - Your dream job could be a long way from where you want to live, so take commuting into account.

- 7. What are your strengths and weaknesses?**
 - Think about your **talents** and **strengths** that make you, **you**.
 - Weaknesses can be tricky. An example could be handing your homework in late. This isn't a great example of organisation or time management.

- 8. Why do you want to pursue this career?**
 - Will you be happy in the career?
 - Try not to focus on the salary even though it's a big part of the choice. You could spend a lot of time in this career, so will you enjoy it?

- 9. Are there jobs available within this environment?**
 - Research the demand in your chosen career. Is there a need for more?
