Getting to campus

Situated close to Bradford, Leeds, the Dales and Lancashire, Keighley College's prime location means you don't have to go far for great education.

We're right next to Keighley train station, with direct links to Bradford Forster Square, Leeds and Skipton — so you can hop off and be at your class in less than five minutes.

Alternatively, the bus station is located just half a mile away, next to the Airedale Shopping Centre, and can be accessed from Bow Street and Towngate. Buses run across the town and out towards Accrington, Burnley, Colne and Nelson — as well as Skipton, Ilkley, Leeds, Bradford, Halifax, Hebden Bridge and everywhere in between.

Travelling by car? We're located on the A6035 Bradford Road, just off the A629 between Skipton and Huddersfield. Please note, there's no student parking on site during the day, other than for bikes and motorbikes, but you'll find plenty of local parking nearby.

Free travel passes are available for all students.

The Keighley Mechanics Institute founded by four local tradesmen, for the 'benefit of the working man'.

1822

There were classes for arithmetic, algebra, drawing, geometry and room for concerts and lectures.

1836

The Institute had grown to a considerable size, with 445 members and over 200 students attending classes.

1864

Scholarships became available for the most talented students from poorer backgrounds. These students were routinely specially selected to feature in exhibitions.

1877

New building in North St was opened, meaning learning, meetings and the library could all be under one roof.

1834

Female Improvement classes were introduced: 140 women joined.

1848

Foundation of the Mechanical Engineering Department.

1895

1890



The new Institute building opened its doors. It included classrooms, studios, committee rooms, a library, an exhibition gallery and a public hall and had a capacity of 1,200.

1870

1887

The building was extended, primarily for the teaching of textile manufacturing.



Brontë family

The Brontë Sisters regularly borrowed books from the Institute's library. Their father, Patrick Brontë, was a patron of the institute and regularly gave lectures there.



The Institute was transferred to the Borough Corporation of Keighley.

1904

The Institute and the Keighley School of Art and Crafts merge to become Keighley Technical College.

1964/5

Minister for Education grants £170,000 for a new building for Keighley Technical College, after a fire caused significant damage to the old one.

1965



1988

Sir Swire Smith

An English woollen manufacturer, educationalist and Liberal Party politician. He was a wealthy patron of the Keighley Mechanics Institute. Smith was also instrumental in the founding of Keighley's first public library.

Now

Keighley Technical College was later built on the site of the former institute, and in 2010 the college opened a new £30 million campus – on Bradford Road, near Keighley railway station – where it remains today.

Entry requirements

English and maths

Some courses may require you to have GCSE English and maths at grade 4 (previous grade C). If you don't have GCSE English and maths at grade 4, we'll build these into your study programme to help you achieve your goals.

We will **always** consider your personal circumstances. If you haven't quite got the grades you wanted, we will help you find the best course for you.

Entry requirements depend on the type of course you're looking to study:



Level 4

Typically A Levels or Diploma/Access Level 3 qualification. NVQ Level 3 may be accepted in some cases.



Level 3

Typically five GCSEs at grades 9-3, including maths and English at minimum grade 4.



Level 2

Usually three/four GCSEs at grade 9-3.



Level 1

Usually three/four GCSEs.



Entry

No formal entry requirements.

How to apply

Get started on your path
in as little as four steps:

1. Apply

Once you've decided which course, or courses, you would like to study, complete the application form online at keighleycollege.ac.uk/apply. Our expert staff will then review your application and be in touch.

2. Interview

You'll be invited for an informal interview, where we'll make sure you're being placed on the most suitable course for you.

3. Offer

Depending on your interview, you'll receive an offer to study with us here at Keighley College. Offers usually depend on you achieving the relevant GCSE grades.

4. Enrolment

We'll contact you before enrolment with all the information you need to complete the process.

Special Educational Needs and Disability Support (SEND)

Here at Keighley College we believe every student has the right to enjoy college and to fulfil their potential. Our SEND team is here for any student who needs specialist support.

Support is provided on an individual basis and will vary depending on assessed needs or, where applicable, an education, health and care plan (EHCP). We will create a personalised support plan, unique to you, and if appropriate, share this with tutors and teaching assistants.

Support is offered in three waves, full details of which can be found on our website. Included on the next page is a brief outline of each wave.

Wave 1

Quality First Teaching+ includes:

- In-class differentiation, such as smaller tasks and visual handouts
- Progress and Attendance Mentor or key person support
- Personalised timetable

Wave 2

Targeted Support includes:

- All of wave 1
- Small group work
- Assistive technology (including hearing loops, radio aids and magnifiers)
- Exam access arrangements

Wave 3

Specialist/High Needs Support:

- All of wave 1 and 2
- Meet and greet
- Familiarisation of campus and rooms
- 1:1 out of class support/additional interventions

Financial Support

As a student of Keighley College, you could be entitled to financial help from the Learner Support Fund.

If you're aged 16-18, an assessment on your household income will be carried out to confirm whether you're eligible. If you're 19+, parental income won't be considered, but that of your spouse or cohabiting partner will be. You will also need to provide evidence of your income.

You could receive support with:

- Meals
- Travel costs
- Uniforms (where required)
- Childcare
- Educational visits and trips

You may be eligible for an **Advanced Learner Loan** to help with course fees if:

- You're 19 or over
- You are studying towards a Level 3 qualification or above
- You've lived in the UK for at least three years

Repayments are flexible and only required when you're in full-time employment earning over the £21,000 threshold.

Foundation Studies

A supportive provision for young adults with SEND. Gain the life skills needed for independent living and increase your employability prospects with our Supported Internships. This provision offers personalised learning programmes that align with your aspirations.

Life Skills

Most suited to young people who have mild to moderate learning difficulties or disabilities who may need high levels of individual educational and pastoral support. This is a practical course, providing the skills needed for greater independence and personal development.

Independent Living & Living and Working

For young people who have mild learning difficulties or disabilities, with a focus on increasing personal development, independence and transferable skills within the world of work and community. Learners will be supported to plan enterprise activities, developing their confidence with in-college work experience, digital skills and independent living.

Pre-Supported Internship

A one year course with a college work placement, working towards increasing confidence in those not yet ready for a Supported Internship. Job coaches mentor and support you to produce a portfolio, increase your confidence in the workplace and develop essential work skills.

Supported Internship

A one year course which includes time within college as well as an unpaid work placement tailored to the young person. Job coaches mentor and support you to prepare for your interview and placement, and support you while you're working.

Many of our previous learners have gained employment within their work placement settings.

A Levels

The traditional post-GCSE qualification, A Levels are an excellent stepping stone between college and the next stage of your journey, whether that be university, higher apprenticeships or employment.

The Advantage of A Levels

- A Levels allow you to explore the subjects that interest you most
- Choose a new subject or expand your knowledge in your favourite topic
- Develop your independent study skills and improve your research ability
- Gain well-respected qualifications that will stand you in good stead no matter your chosen destination
- A Levels are Level 3 qualifications that can support you applying to jobs or provide UCAS points to get you into university

We offer the following A Levels:

- Business
- English Language

We also offer the A Level Pathway that combines traditional learning with employability skills and industry insight which supports progression into the workplace. The A Level Pathway is a three year course and is suitable for those without GCSEs.

Entry requirements

Each A Level course will have different requirements, but most require five GCSEs at grade 9-4. Some subjects will require specific GCSEs and grades. Please see our course pages for more details.

T Levels

T Levels are a two year course, equivalent to three A Levels. They combine academic study with industry experience.

T Levels focus on transferable skills, expert knowledge and learning that will get you hired, or ready for university. Courses are designed with input from employers, and they have been endorsed by over 200 businesses across West Yorkshire.

All students complete a 45 day industry placement, exploring their chosen sector with local employers and working on meaningful real-life projects.

Vocational courses enhance your academic learning with practical and realistic work scenarios. Once completed you can progress to further study, higher education, apprenticeships or employment. Vocational courses are ideal if you're looking to learn the theory of a subject, but also want to acquire practical skills that see the theory applied in real-life situations.

From business to travel, engineering to hairdressing, we have over 60 vocational courses to choose from. Some subjects, such as childcare and education, are offered at Level 1 through to Level 3, meaning you can choose the appropriate level for you and progress your knowledge as you complete each course. Courses range in length from one to two years and a large number are offered on a part-time and full-time basis, meaning you can study at a pace to suit you.

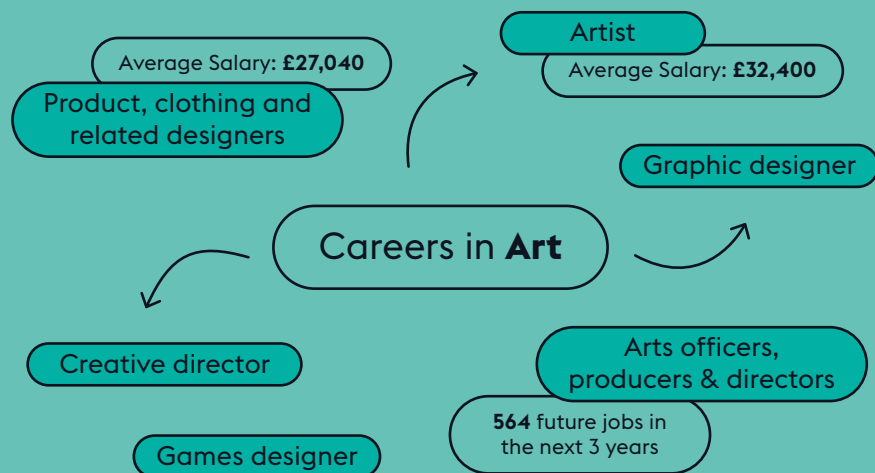
